 - Records of income and expenses
 - Rental asset information (cost, date placed in service, etc.) for depreciation
- Retirement Income
 - o Pension/IRA/annuity income (1099-R)
 - Traditional IRA basis (prior-year Forms 8606 showing amounts already taxed)
 - o Social Security/RRB income (SSA-1099, RRB-1099)

 - o Forms 1098-T from educational institutions
 - o Receipts for qualified educational expenses
 - o Records of scholarships or fellowships
 - Form 1098-E for student loan interest
- State & Local Taxes or Sales Tax
 - Amount of state/local income tax paid (other than wage withholding), or amount of state and local sales tax paid
 - o Invoice for large item purchases such as cars, boats, motorcycles etc.
 - o Amount of real estate taxes paid
 - o Amount of personal property taxes paid
- Retirement & Other Savings
 - o Form 5498-SA showing HSA contributions
 - o Form 5498 showing IRA contributions
 - o All other 5498 series forms (5498-QA, 5498-ESA)
- Federally Declared Disaster
 - o City/county you lived/worked/had property in
 - Records to support property losses (appraisal, clean-up costs, etc.)
 - o Records of rebuilding/repair costs
